



2021 Legislative Accomplishments: Conservative Promises Made, Promises Kept

TULSA, OK – Oklahoma State Senator Cody Rogers, District 37, which represents largely represents Jenks, Sand Springs, and West Tulsa has had significant accomplishments working closely with Governor Kevin Stitt by passing into law several conservative pieces of legislation.

Much like President Trump and Governor Kevin Stitt, Senator Cody Rogers was a complete outsider to politics. During his first legislative session, Rogers has leveraged his business background experience into keeping the promises he made during the 2020 campaign. Here are a few of those accomplishments that he authored or co-authored and have been signed into law:

- **HB2441: Prohibiting an Abortion if there's a detectable heartbeat** [date of last action 04/26/2021; Approved by the Governor]
- **HB2648: Oklahoma Religious Freedom Act protecting the right to worship** [date of last action 04/26/2021; Approved by the Governor]
- **HB1775: Banning Critical Race Theory from Education** [date of last action 05/10/2021; Approved by the Governor]
- **HB2805: Helping Livestock Employees of a Family on Ad Valorem Tax Exemption** [date of last action 05/07/2021; Approved by the Governor]
- **HB1150: Helping Plumbers with Licensing Issues** [date of last action 04/28/2021; Approved by the Governor]

In addition to these pieces of legislation that were, in part, due to overreach following the COVID-19 crisis, such as churches being shut down due to COVID-concerns which clearly violated a Church's right to freely worship as defined in the U.S. Constitution, Senator Rogers championed numerous other conservative policies.

During recent threats from the Biden Administration, Senator Rogers promptly began working with Senate Leadership and Governor Kevin Stitt to protect Oklahomans right to keep and bear arms by passing SB631. The bill also known as the Second Amendment Sanctuary Act, would prevent the confiscation or surrender of firearms, gun accessories, or ammunition from law-abiding Oklahomans, protecting the right to keep and bear arms guaranteed by the United States Constitution.
